About the program: "Shots Fired!" is the last thing you expect to hear in the workplace or at school. Unfortunately, the possibility of this contemporary, violent event taking place in your community has become a reality that employees and students have to deal with. Although no one is exempt from this threat, injury or death does not have to be the inevitable outcome. The key to survival is the proper mindset and an awareness of tools enabling you to act with purpose, to take control, and to be mindful, not fearful. Learn about the survival mindset and realistic strategies for dealing with an active shooter situation.

Mr. Spivey has 20 years experience in the DoD. As the Chief of the Joint Personnel Recovery Agency Policy and Oversight Division, he managed and provided oversight to all hostage survival-training programs in the DoD from 1997 to 2002 and authored multiple hostage-related policy and doctrine documents. Since forming the Spivey Group in November 2002, he has personally trained 8,000+ individuals in abduction prevention and hostage survival procedures. He has a B.S. in international relations from the United States Air Force Academy and an M.S. in counseling and human resource development from South Dakota State University.

Mr. Rugala, a 26-year veteran with the FBI and one of the profilers in the unit made famous by the book and movie *The Silence of the Lambs*, specializes in the detailed analysis of violent crimes including: murder, sexual assault, extortion, kidnapping, domestic violence, stalking, arson, bombings, school violence, and workplace violence. He has consulted with the protection detail of the British royal family and with members of New Scotland Yard. Mr. Rugala holds a bachelor's degree in biology from Penn State University and has attended graduate school in public administration at the University of New Mexico.

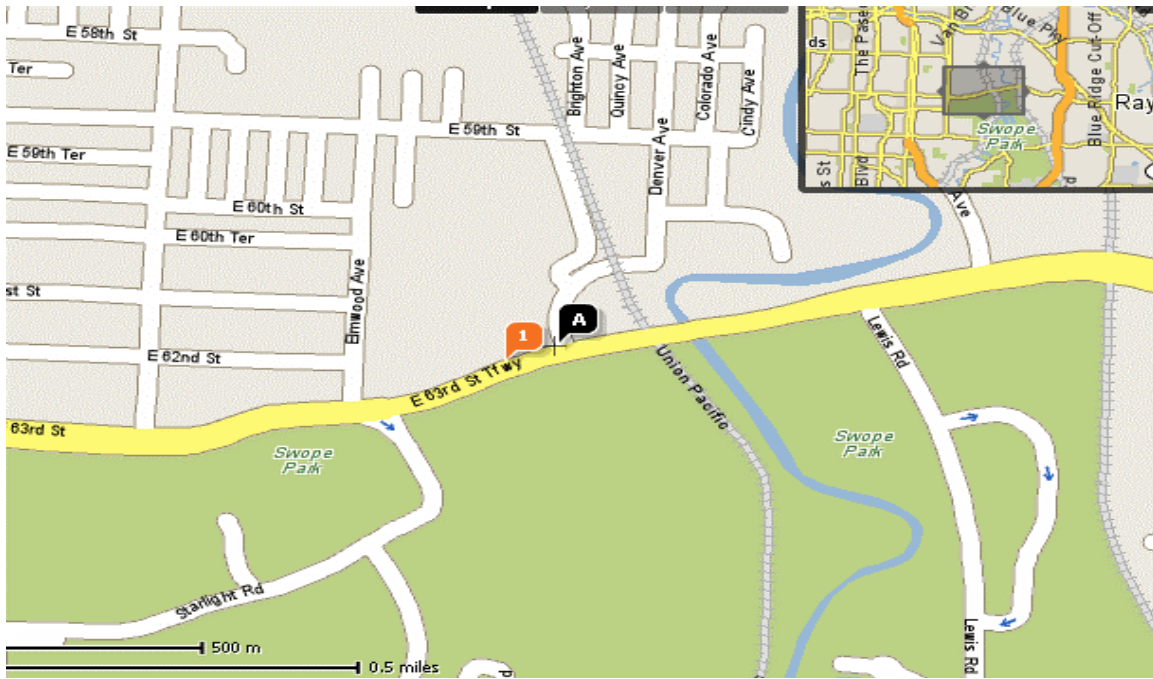

Directions

1. **From KCI Airport**, take I-29 South, to I-35 South, take I-35 South to east side of the Downtown Loop, carefully look for Hwy-71 South (also known as Bruce Watkins Freeway) signs, take Hwy-71 South to 63rd St. exit, turn left and take 63rd St. East to 4800 E. 63rd St. (about 1.3 miles).
2. **From I-35 coming from the North**, take I-35 South to the east side of the Downtown Loop, to Hwy-71 South as described above in #1.
3. **From I-35 coming from the South**, take the I-435 Loop East, continue the I-435 loop to the North, to 63rd Traffic way exit, turn left and take 63rd St. West about 2.5 miles to 4800 E. 63rd St.
4. **From Hwy-71 from the South**, take Hwy-71 North and carefully follow Hwy-71 signs, to where I-435 North splits off, follow I-435 North to 63rd St. Traffic way exit, turn left and take 63rd St. West about 2.5 miles to 4800 E. 63rd St.
5. **From I-70 coming from the East**, take I-70 West to I-435 South, take I-435 South to the Hwy-350 split, take Hwy-350 a short distance (0.5 miles) to 63rd St. exit, turn right and take 63rd St. West about 2.5 miles to 4800 E. 63rd St.
6. **From I-70 coming from the West**, take I-70 East to the I-670 split and take I-670 about 2 miles to K.C Downtown area, where it re-combines with I-70 East, then follow I-70 East to I-435 South, take I-435 South to the Hwy-350 split, take Hwy-350 a short distance (0.5 miles) to the 63rd St. exit, turn right and take 63rd St. West about 2.5 miles to 4800 E. 63rd St.

Parking

Free parking available on-site. North Parking lot.
