Physical Security Professional (PSP®) - The PSP® designation is the certification for those whose primary responsibility is to conduct threat surveys, design integrated security systems that include equipment, procedures and people, or install, operate and maintain those systems.

ITEM: H.R. 5300: Fairness and Accuracy in Employment Background Checks Act of 2010

This proposed legislation, introduced in May 2010, would require the “Attorney General to establish and enforce procedures to ensure the prompt release of accurate federal criminal background records and information exchanged for employment-related purposes.” A provision wherein a person’s arrest record would be dropped from the database if the disposition of the case remains unknown or cannot be determined after one year, has provoked opposition from some in the security industry who use the database for employment-related criminal background checks.

ITEM: GAO: Critical Infrastructure Protection: Key Private and Public Cyber Expectations Need to Be Consistently Addressed

In a July 15, 2010 report (GAO-10-628), The Government Accountability Office says that less than one-third of private sector stakeholders reported receiving “usable timely, and actionable cyber threat information and alerts or access to sensitive or classified information” from federal partners in the protection of critical infrastructure. The GAO recommended that the national Cybersecurity Coordinator and the Department of Homeland Security work with their federal and private sector partners to enhance information-sharing efforts.
