To KC ASIS Chapter 50 Members:

The following information potentially affects members who currently hold a Kansas City, Missouri Private Investigator's Class A license. I currently know of several members who are either contract investigators or in house corporate investigators who hold a Kansas City, Missouri investigators license. I recently received a reminder post card about the new statewide Missouri Investigator licensing law that became effective January 31, 2010. After reviewing the information available on line, Missouri Statutes 324.1100 to 324.1148 and application for licensure I followed up with a phone inquiry to the Missouri Board of Private Investigator Examiners. As a result, I have some observations I would like share with our membership for their review and feedback.

Observations:

- There is no provision for firearms and in fact it does not appear in the legislation at all. The official stance is that the Board is neutral regarding the issue of firearms. If you currently hold a Kansas City, Missouri Class A private investigator license that will expire this year you will have to obtain a Missouri Concealed Carry Permit (CCW) in order to legally carry a concealed firearm in the future. The permit requires 8 hours of training for a certified instructor in the Missouri county you reside in. As a current Missouri CCW instructor I can attest that the CCW qualification is much easier than the current police officer qualification that was required to obtain the Kansas City, Missouri license. A CCW permit holder will have to pay close attention to the no weapons allowed postings by businesses even while working as an investigator.
- A new applicant is required to have (2) years of experience to qualify for a Missouri private investigators license. But there is nothing in the statutes outlining what type of experience is required and I presume is left to the discretion of the licensing board.
- The legislation also does not specifically list what disqualifies a person from obtaining a license. Currently a felony does not automatically disqualify a new applicant for a Missouri Private Investigators license. The current application reads as follows; Have you been convicted or entered a plea of nolo contendere to a criminal offense, regardless of the disposition and including the receiving of a suspended imposition of sentence within the last two (2) years?

Memo to Members (continued):



When I called the office of Missouri Board of Private Investigator Examiners and asked specifically about this question, the response I got was that a felony does not automatically bar an applicant for license and applications are reviewed on a case by base basis.

I have held investigator licenses in several states and have been the licensed agency manager as well and in my opinion state wide licensing for Missouri overall is a good thing but I think this legislation needs improvement in several areas. I am shocked that someone with a felony record could even been considered for licensure as long as it was not within the last two years. For those members interested and or affected by this please review and provide me with your feedback and suggestions on how to proceed with suggested amendments to this legislation and how to pursue these improvements.

ITEM: British Visa Rules Discourage Foreign Pupils at Private Schools

A report in the London Evening Standard says "private schools have been hit by tough new visa rules brought in to prevent terrorism and stop illegal immigration. Wealthy families from China and Hong Kong, who traditionally favour sending their children to British private schools, are turning to the US instead because they find the visa application system so complicated."

ITEM: Government and Industry Protect Cruise Ships

The Government Accountability Office reports "federal agencies, cruise ship and facility operators, and law enforcement entities have taken various actions to enhance the security of cruise ships and their facilities and implement related laws, regulations, and guidance, and additional actions are under way." Cruise ship and facility operators have developed and implemented security plans, and the Coast Guard is "expanding a program to deter and prevent small vessel attacks, and is developing additional security measures." However, Customs and Border Protection should consider "requiring cruise lines to provide passenger reservation data."
